Pastoral Reflection:

In the Film *The Old Man and the Sea*, based on Ernest Hemmingway’s novel, Spencer Tracy plays the lead role of an aging fisherman. As the Old Man in Hemmingway’s saga, Tracy battles for hours to catch a great fish, only to have it attacked by sharks as he tows it toward shore. By the time he reaches shore, only the backbone of the giant fish is left. The Old Man beaches his skiff, shoulders the mast and trudges up the hill to his shack. He says: “Man is not made for defeat. Man can be destroyed, but not defeated.” Why would Jesus choose fishermen as his first disciples? It certainly wasn’t for their educational background or their training in Scripture. Such men would be found in the synagogues, not by the seashore. No, the first disciples were probably chosen because they were like the Old Man in Hemmingway’s story. Not pious, but good men down deep. Not easily discouraged, but patient and persevering. Not self-indulgent, but hard working. Not educated, but full of wisdom. And like the Old Man, they would come to know that “man is not made for defeat.” Through their experiences with Jesus, these first disciples would learn that “man can be destroyed, but not defeated.” As disciples of Jesus, we too are called to persevere despite all the odds and to be a source of hope. -Fr. Reflexión Pastoral -

En la película 'El Anciano y el Mar', basada en la novela de Ernest Hemmingway, Spencer Tracy juega el papel de un pescador envejecido. En la historia del hombre anciano de Hemmingway, Tracy batalla por horas para capturar un gran pescado, solo para que fuera atacado por tiburones al sacarlo hacia la orilla del mar. Para el tiempo que alcanzaba la orilla, solo los huesos del gigante pescado quedaban. El anciano encalla su botecillo, se hecha el palo al hombre y empieza la caminata hacia su choza., y dice: 'El hombre no fue creado para la derrota. El hombre puede ser destruido pero no derrotado.' ¿Por qué Jesús escogió pescadores como sus primeros discípulos? Ciertamente no fue por el pasado educacional de ellos o por su entrenamiento en las Escrituras. Tales hombres habían de ser encontrados en las sinagogas, no en las orillas del mar. No, los primeros discípulos fueron probablemente escogidos porque eran como el hombre Anciano en la historia de Hemmingway.

No piadosos, pero hombres buenos muy por dentro. No fácilmente desanimados, sino pacientes y perseverantes. Sin satisfacción propia, pero hombres trabajadores. Sin educación, pero llenos de sabiduría. Y como el Anciano, llegaron a saber que 'el hombre no fue creado para la derrota'. Por medio de sus experiencias con Jesús, estos primeros discípulos aprenderían que 'el hombre puede ser destruido pero no derrotado'. Como discípulos de Jesús, somos llamados a perseverar no obstante todo lo que se pone contra de uno y de ser un recurso de esperanza.
