Pastoral Reflection:

The Beatitude is called the spirituality of the Gospel. It tells us how to apply the teachings of Jesus in our everyday life and so to find the fullness of life that he wants us to have. The Beatitude is the key to happiness. One writer calls it The Be-Happy Attitudes. Here's another translation of the beatitude in Matthews gospel: "*Blessed are the poor in Spirit; the reign of God is theirs:*" **I need help; I can't do it alone.** "*Blessed are the sorrowing; they shall be consoled:*" **I may be hurting, but I will bounce back.** "*Blessed are the meek; they shall inherit the land:*" **I've got to remain calm, kind and corrected.** "*Blessed are they who hunger and thirst for holiness; they shall have their fill:*" **I really want to do the right thing.** "*Blessed are they who show mercy; mercy shall be theirs:*" **I'm going to treat others the way I want them to treat me.** "*Blessed are the single hearted; they shall see God:*" **I'm going to keep the faith flowing through me all the time.** "*Blessed are the peacemakers; they shall be called children of God:*" **I'm going to be a bridge-builder, a peacemaker.** "*Blessed are those persecuted for holiness' sake; the reign of God is theirs:*" **I'm going to be happy anyway.** Problems and pain are part of everyone's pilgrimage. But by taking a positive approach to them through the beatitudes or be-happy attitudes, we can truly be a happy people and live our lives to the fullest. **-Fr. Dennis**

PASTORAL COORDINATOR'S CORNER

2005 DDF PLEDGES: People have asked me how to handle their 2005 DDF Pledge cards. The best way to describe it is a 3 step process:

1. Prayerfully consider your ability to make a pledge that can be paid over 10 months.
2. Fill out the card by making a pledge of any amount that is reflective of your ability and place the completed pledge card in the envelope that was included in the letter you received.
3. Either mail the envelope to the Diocese as it is addressed or drop it, along with your regular offering, into the collection basket and we will mail it for you.

The place to spend the most time in this process is Step #1.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

The prayers surrounding baptism often speak of being "clothed in Christ," and clothes are an important consideration. In ancient times, adults were probably baptized without any clothes at all, and old texts survive asking people to leave fancy garb and jewelry behind as they enter the font. Baptism was typically in a private place, the community waited elsewhere, and the casting off of clothing was hardly a public moment, nor was it embarrassing in ancient cultures where privacy was largely unknown.

Nonetheless, what was left behind on one side of the font was replaced on the other as a white robe was wrapped around the newly baptized. It was a robe of honor, a dazzling sign of a new beginning for a society that valued clothing as a sign of personal identity. For the newly baptized, a whole week in white garments was the rule, through the second Sunday of Easter, called "Sunday in *Albis*," because of all the folks wearing their baptismal robes.

Un escritor las llama 'Las Actitudes para ser Feliz'. Aquí esta otra traducción para las Bienaventuranzas en el Evangelio de San Mateo: 'Felices los pobres de espíritu, el Reino de Dios es de ellos': **Necesito ayuda; no puede hacerlo solo.** 'Felices los que lloran, ellos serán consolados': **Tengo dolor, pero me recuperaré.** 'Felices los pacientes, ellos recibirán la tierra en herencia': **Tengo que permanecer calmado, bueno y corregido.** 'Felices los que tienen hambre y sed de justicia: ellos serán saciados'. **Verdaderamente quiero hacer lo que esta bien.** 'Felices los misericordiosos, porque ellos tendrán misericordia': **Voy a tratar a los demás como quiero que me traten.** 'Felices los limpios de corazón, ellos verán a Dios': **Voy a mantener la fe fluyendo en mi todo el tiempo.** 'Felices los que buscan la paz, serán llamados hijos de Dios': **Seré un constructor de puentes, alguien que hace la paz.** 'Felices los perseguidos por causa de justicia, de ellos será el Reino de Dios': **De todos modos seré feliz.** Los problemas y el dolor son parte del peregrinaje de todos.
