Pastoral Reflection:

On this Good Shepherd Sunday we are presented with the image of Jesus as the gate, not simply a good shepherd. Through the gate the flock is led to green pastures in the morning and to safe shelter at night. This was the role that Jesus named for himself. We are moved to reflect upon leadership today as we hear Peter proclaim the Good News with such boldness that many came to know Jesus and to be baptized. There is no disputing the fact that Peter was a great leader. Faced with the inner pain and embarrassment of his denial, and surrounded by many who doubted Christ's resurrection, Peter embraced the newness of life in the Spirit coming at Pentecost. As our Easter journey reaches its mid-point, may we be inspired by Peter's leadership. Through our baptism, we are called to live as followers in the ways of Christ. We must carefully consider our own example and the invitation we extend to others. May we be a clear sign of Christ's love toward those around us that many others may also know and love Him. *-Fr. PASTORAL COORDINATOR'S CORNER

LITURGY

Last weekend two events occurred that brought home the importance of our Eucharistic Liturgy as Catholics. The first happened at the noon Mass. The priest who was to have presided did not show up. Fr. Dennis came back to celebrate that Liturgy with us. The Mass started at 12:15. Those assembled were told of the alternative which would have been to have a "Sunday Celebration in the absence of a Priest". Most people know this as a "Communion Service" and can have a Deacon or Extraordinary Minister of the Eucharist conduct the service. While this is an alternative that was almost used on Sunday, it would not have expressed the 'fullness' of the Eucharistic Liturgy which includes the consecration of the bread and wine to the Body and Blood of Our Lord in the presence of those assembled. The Assembly has a vital role in each Liturgy so much so that, even in the absence of a Priest, the Church has made provision for the faithful to receive Communion and celebrate the Lord's Day together.

The other occasion took place on Sunday night at the 6 P.M. Mass for Pope John Paul II. It was a beautiful and memorable Liturgy that was presided over by our Bishop and concelebrated with the Priests of the High Desert Vicariate. This Eucharistic Liturgy was the ideal in the sense that the faithful, gathered with their shepherd in the person of the Bishop, worship as the "Local Church". We are the Church of San Bernardino and, just as the early Christians in the Church of Jerusalem or Corinth or Ephesus, when we worship as a community gathered around our leader (the Bishop) we show, in the fullest sense, the meaning of a Community that is in 'communion' with the Universal Church and each other.

There is no substitute for the Eucharistic Liturgy and, for that to be fully realized, the presence of a Priest as the Presider who acts "*in persona Christi*" is essential. On this Good Shepherd Sunday we, as Catholics, should pray for vocations to the Priesthood.
