Pastoral Reflection:

While the Pope was planning his homily, your fellow parishioners were taking part in a planning session for the future of the Church at Holy Family. Over 20 people from every facet of parish life gathered in the Parish Hall on Saturday, April 23rd from 9 A.M. to 3 P.M. to enter into a process that will lead to our first 5 year plan. Topics such as facilities, leadership formation, communication, catechesis, outreach and stewardship were covered in a wide ranging effort to put some parish goals to our Vision Statement. Once this is completed, we will be holding "Town Hall" meetings to begin the process of collaboratively developing practical ways to implement programs to achieve the goals. Participating in the planning sessions was an experience that gave life to the Pope's observation that "The Church Is Alive". It is alive in those who offered their time and talent to assist their fellow parishioners by beginning the planning of the future of Holy Family. -Deacon Vic
