Last week, I wrote about the fact that Pentecost was a reversal of the Tower of Babel story. All nations could speak and understand each other.

For the next 4 weeks, I will be in San Antonio, TX at the Mexican American Cultural Center (MACC) for an intensive Spanish language course. My hope is to be able to communicate with members of our community who can not yet communicate in English. Between our offering English as a Second Language (ESL) courses and my taking Spanish, I hope that we can work together at better understanding each other.

However, more than just language needs to be understood for good communication to take place – especially in community. Communication is made easier with common language but it cannot end there. We must look to each others hopes and dreams, the joys and sorrows in our lives, and the things that inspire us to truly understand our relationships with each other.

I am going to try to learn a language that I do not now know. 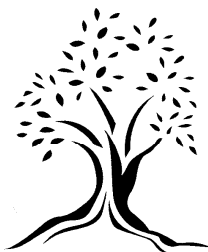
