Pastoral Reflection:

In these days of indifference to the Gospel message, it is good to recall the instruction Jesus gave to His apostles as He prepared them for their mission of preaching. Opposition to the Gospel is inevitable as He points out the danger they will face. People whose evil stands to be exposed will not tolerate their preaching and will behave in an aggressive manner towards them. Their mission in a world that does not readily accept the good news will meet with resistance. This gospel is a reminder that we cannot expect the community around us to receive the teaching of Christ with open arms. Jesus makes no secret of the fact that bearers of the word of God will suffer ridicule and rejection, yet He urges us to bear witness to Him openly and to be fearless in making a stand for truth and justice however unpopular this may make us. -Fr. Stewardship IV – (In 1987 a newspaper photographer was sent to Ecuador to cover a devastating earthquake. In the midst of incredible suffering, he witnessed a scene that moved him deeply. This is what he wrote.) The line was long but moving briskly. And in that line at the very end stood a young girl about 12 years of age. She waited patiently as those in front of that long line received a little rice, some canned goods or a little fruit. Slowly, she was getting closer to the front of the line, closer to the food. From time to time, she would glance across the street. She didn’t notice the growing concern on the faces of those distributing the food. The food was running out. Their anxiety began to show more and more but she didn’t notice. Her attention seemed always to focus on the three figures under a tree across the street. At long last, she stepped forward to get her food. But the only thing left was a banana. The workers were almost ashamed to tell her that this was all that was left. She didn’t seem to mind. Quietly, she took the precious gift and ran across the street where three small children waited – maybe her sisters and a brother. Very deliberately, she peeled the banana and very carefully divided it into three equal parts. She placed the precious food into the eager hands of the three youngsters. Then she sat down and began to lick the inside of the banana peel. In that moment, I swear I saw the face of God. -Deacon Vic

Mayordomía IV - (En 1987 un fotógrafo del periódico fue enviado a Ecuador para cubrir un terremoto devastador. En el medio del sufrimiento increíble, él atestiguó una escena que lo movió profundamente. Esto es lo que él escribió.)

La línea era larga pero de mudanza enérgicamente. Y en esa línea en el final estaba parada a muchacha joven cerca de 12 años de edad. Ella esperó pacientemente como éstos delante de esa línea larga recibieron un poco de arroz, algunas mercancías conservadas o poca fruta. Lentamente, ella se acercaba al frente de la línea, más cercano al alimento. De vez en cuando, ella daba una mirada a través de la calle. Ella no notó la preocupación, cada vez mayor, en las caras de éstos que distribuían el alimento. El alimento se estaba acabando. Sus ansiedades comenzó a demostrarse más y más pero ella no notó. Su atención se parecía siempre centrarse en las tres figuras debajo de un árbol a través de la calle.

Por fin, ella caminó adelante para conseguir el alimento. Pero la única cosa dejada era un plátano. Los trabajadores estaban casi avergonzados decirle que esto fuera todo lo que quedo. Ella no le parecía importar. Reservadamente, ella tomó el regalo precioso y corrió a través de la calle donde tres niños pequeños esperaron - quizá sus hermanas y un hermano.

Muy deliberadamente, ella peló el plátano y lo dividió muy cuidadosamente en tres porciones iguales. Ella colocó el alimento precioso en las manos impacientes de los tres jóvenes. Entonces ella se sentó abajo y comenzó a lamer el interior de la cáscara del plátano. En ese momento, juro que yo vi la cara de Dios.
