HOLY FAMILY CHURCH**10th Anniversary Celebration of the New Building****March 17, 1996 — 2006**

In August 1960, Bishop Charles F. Buddy, of the Diocese of San Diego, asked Father Carmine Porro, who already was Pastor of St. Cecilia Church in Oro Grande to take care of the few Catholic families, then residing in Hesperia. This was the beginning of Holy Family Catholic Church in Hesperia. The seventies brought a change in church leadership, when Father Porro was forced to resign due to ill health. On, October 5, 1971, Father Michael O'Day was assigned to the Hesperia Parish by Bishop Leo Maher of the San Diego Diocese. In 1984, as the parish continued to grow, a major remodeling and expansion project began. The seating capacity of the church including the Mother's Chapel, was increased from 300 to 600. Included in the expansion was a Parish Hall. On March 17, 1996, under the leadership of Monsignor Phillip A. Behan, after a journey of three and a half years, with joy and excitement we dedicated our new 26,000 sq. ft., 1,500 seat church. Today we gather to celebrate the 10th Anniversary of that special day, and to give thanks to God for all those who made this possible. May it continue to be a place of Sacrament and a source of Grace to the Glory of the Father, who with the Son and the Holy Spirit lives and reigns for ever and ever. Amen.

BLOOD DRIVE

The Knights of Columbus are having a Blood Drive on Sunday, April 2nd in connection with the Columbian Squires' Safety Fair. At our Blood Drive in January, we had 52 people attempt to give blood of which 37 were successful. Our goal is 60 pints and we need your help. There are a lot of excuses we can think of to not give but only one reason to try to give - LIFE! A pint of blood will actually help three different individuals as donations are separated into Red Blood Cells, Plasma and Platelets which are utilized for different needs. Anyone between the ages of 17 and 76, in good health and weighing at least 110 pounds can donate. Donors can only donate once every 56 days.

Common Excuses to NOT give blood: No one has ever asked me - Please consider yourself asked. You can help save the life of a premature baby, a cancer patient or an accident victim with your donation.

I'm too busy...- God forbid that you or a family member need a pint of blood to stay alive and when the call goes out, everyone is too busy. Jesus died for us when he was called. An hour of your time is a little price to pay to help save one of God's children.

I'm afraid - Nearly everyone who has never given is! But the feeling of giving a gift of life far outweighs the minimal pain you may experience.

I don't have any blood to spare - Within 48 hours of your donation, your body will replenish what is lost.

I've been turned down before - If you haven't been PERMANENTLY deferred, please try again. Please register to give and the nurse will check for you at the event.

I have high blood pressure - Individuals with high blood pressure CAN give if the pressure is ok at the time of donating.

My blood is no good because of previous illnesses - Are you absolutely sure? Many people are confused on this point. Call 1-800-879-4484 to make sure. Being deferred once does not mean you are permanently deferred.

Sign up now for a time slot to speed up the process. Call David Rangel at 985-5374 or 247-6163. Donations will start at 9 a.m. till 2 p.m. Make sure to allow one hour for the process. Donate early if you are going to noon mass or donate late if you are going to 8 a.m. The bottom line is - DONATE. What do you say? What would Our Lord say?

IGLESIA SAGRADA FAMILIA**Celebrando el 10o. Aniversario de la Nueva Iglesia****17 de Marzo, 1996 – 2006**

En Agosto de 1960, el Obispo Charles F. Buddy, de la Diócesis de San Diego, le pidió al Padre Carmine Porro, quién ya era Párroco de la Iglesia Santa Cecilia en Oro Grande, para tomar el cuidado de las pocas familias católicas que entonces residían en Hesperia. Éste fue el principio de la Iglesia Católica de la Sagrada Familia en Hesperia. Los años 70 trajeron un cambio en el liderazgo de la iglesia, cuando forzaron al Padre Porro resignar debido a la mala salud. El 5 de Octubre, 1971, el Obispo Leo Maher de la Diócesis de San Diego asignó el Padre Michael O'Day a la parroquia de Hesperia. En 1984, la parroquia continuó creciendo y un gran proyecto de remodelación y extensión comenzó. La capacidad de asientos de la iglesia incluyendo la Capilla de Nuestra Madre, fue aumentado de 300 a 600. Incluido en la extensión fue un Salón Parroquial.

El 17 de Marzo, 1996, bajo la dirección del Monseñor Phillip A. Behan, después de una jornada de tres años y medio, con alegría y entusiasmo dedicamos nuestra Iglesia de 26,000 pies cuadrados con 1,500 asientos. Hoy nos reunimos para celebrar el Décimo Aniversario de ese día tan especial, y para dar gracias a Dios por todos los que hicieron esto posible. Que continúe siendo un lugar de Sacramento y una fuente de Gracia a la Gloria del Padre que con el Hijo y el Espíritu Santo reine y vive, por los siglos de los siglos. Amen.
